#### WHAT DO CLINICAL VETERINARY ASSISTANTS DO?

Veterinary assistants work side by side with veterinarians and other veterinary professionals to provide medical care to animals of all kinds. They assist and perform general patient care and responsibilities that frequently include the following:

- Obtaining history of patients & vital signs
- Restraining animals for examination & procedures
- Prepare supplies for procedures
- Monitor hospitalized patients
- Educate pet owners
- Basic kennel work

#### **JOB OUTLOOK**



The Bureau of Labor and Statistics projects employment of Veterinary Assistants will increase 19% (faster than average) between 2020 and 2030. (bls.gov)

### **SALARY**



The median salary of Veterinary Assistants was \$29,780 per year. In May 2021, the median **annual wage for all workers was \$45,760**. (bls.gov)
