## Sample resource excerpt:

In a survey of 200 community college students, when participants were asked to rank their favorite dessert out of a list of ten options, ice cream sundaes were by far the top ranked dessert out of all choices presented.

## Possible in-text citations you could create based on the above resource:

- Paraphrasing:
  - Greider proved in her study that students favored ice cream sundaes over any other dessert (50).
  - Participants in one prominent study favored ice cream sundaes over any other dessert (Greider 50).
- Quoting:
  - One prominent study proved that in a survey, "ice cream sundaes were by far the top ranked dessert" (Greider 50).
  - Greider proved in her study that "ice cream sundaes were by far the top ranked dessert" (50).

Format of references (for works cited page at the end):

- Academic journal article:
  - Format: Author Last name, First name. "Title of Article." *Title of Journal*, Volume, Issue, year of publication, pages. doi
  - Example: Greider, Julia. "Popularity of Desserts." *Food Studies Journal*, vol. 25, no. 4, 2019, pp. 40-55. doi:10.1108/03090560710821161
- Book:
  - Format: Author Last name, First name. *Title of Book*. Publisher's Name, year of publication.
  - o Example: Greider, Julia. This is a Book About Dessert. RCC Press, 2019.
- Website:
  - Format: Author Last name, First name. "Title of Page." *Website Name*, date of publication, url. Accessed date.
  - Example: Greider, Julia. "Phish food." *Ben and Jerry's*, 20 Sept. 2019, https://www.benjerry.com/flavors/phish-food-ice-cream. Accessed 1 Dec. 2020.

## When there are multiple authors:

- 2 authors: list both names, connected by "and".
  - In-text: (Greider and Smith, 50)
  - Works cited page: Greider, Julia, and Sophia Smith.
- 3 or more authors: list first author plus "et al."
  - o In-text: (Greider et al., 50)
  - Works cited page: Greider, Julia, et al.
